## How to use Colomycin with your nebuliser

When your healthcare professional prescribed Colomycin you will have been shown how to use it with a nebuliser. Nebulisers are a way of converting liquid medicines into droplets which enable them to be inhaled into the lungs.

- Your dose has been chosen by your healthcare professional as the one which is most suitable for you.
- You should read the package leaflet before you start using Colomycin for the first time, and always check that the product is within its expiry date. You should also keep the leaflet for future reference.
- Colomycin needs to be nebulised in a well-ventilated room. Depending on the device used, your healthcare professional may also recommend that a filter valve is used with the nebuliser.

- Always use Colomycin exactly as your healthcare professional has told you. If you are unsure about the dose you should be taking or any of the instructions in this guide you should check with our healthcare professional.
- Colomycin is normally inhaled twice daily.
  You need to take Colomycin on a regular and continual basis to obtain the best results.

Please read through the entire guide to make sure you understand every step before starting to mix Colomycin.

Colomycin can be used with a variety of nebulisers, such as the PARI eFlow rapid or LC PLUS. Nebulisation time is dependent upon the specification and type of nebuliser used. Please check with the healthcare professional who issued the nebuliser to make sure that it is suitable for Colomycin.

# How to prepare Colomycin<sup>°</sup> (Colistimethate Sodium) for nebulisation

This leaflet is intended for patients prescribed Colomycin and their carers

Colomycin can be used with a variety of nebulisers, such as the PARI eFlow rapid or LC PLUS

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Take one vial of Colomycin and gently tap the glass vial so that the powder settles to the bottom This helps ensure you get the proper dose of medication.



Wash your hands.

Flip open the plastic cap.

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Carefully rip the foil seal from around the top of the vial taking care to remove it completely.



Carefully remove the rubber bung.

Your healthcare professional will have recommended and prescribed the most appropriate diluent for you. Typically this is 2-4 mls of sterile water or sterile salt water (0.9% saline).

Carefully mix the solution by shaking the vial gently in the air like this.

DO NOT use Colomycin if you notice visible particles in the solution after dissolution.





Pour the solution into the nebuliser.

It is now ready to use.

Colomycin should be used immediately after preparation.

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N.B. Depending on the type of nebuliser used there may be some residual solution in the bottom of the nebuliser chamber.

Your nebuliser chamber should be cleaned after each use. Please follow the manufacturer's recommended cleaning routine.

### IMPORTANT:

Do not mix Colomycin with any other product for nebulisation at the same time.

If you think you have given yourself too much Colomycin, or if you have forgotten to use Colomycin and missed a dose refer to the package leaflet.

If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor, pharmacist or nurse. This includes any possible side effects not listed in the package leaflet.
