What Rosuvastatin is and what it is used for

Rosuvastatin belongs to a group of medicines called statins.

medicines called statins.

You have been prescribed
Rosuvastatin because:

• you have a high cholesterol level.
This means you are at risk from a
heart attack or stroke.
Rosuvastatin is used ren 6 years
or older to treat high cholesterol.
You have been advised to take a statin,
because changing your diet and doing
more exercise were not enough to
correct your cholesterol levels. You
should continue with your
cholesterol-lowering diet and exercise
while you are taking Rosuvastatin.

Heart attack, stroke and other problems can be caused by a disease called atherosclerosis. Atherosclerosis is due to build up of fatty deposits in your arteries.

Why is it important to keep taking Rosuvastatin?

Rosuvastatin is used to correct the levels of fatty substances in the blood called lipids, the most common of which is cholesterol.
There are different types of cholesterol (LDL-C) and 'good' cholesterol (IDL-C).

Rosuvastatin can reduce the "bad" cholesterol end increase the "good" cholesterol and increase the "good" cholesterol and increase the "good" cholesterol.

It works by helping to block your body's production of 'bad' cholesterol. It also improves your your blood. You remove it from your bloods for most people, high cholesterol does not affect the way they feel because it does not produce any symptoms. However, if it is left untreated, fatty deposits can build up in the walls of your blood vessels causing them to narrow. Sometimes, these narrowed blood blood vessels causing them to narrow. Sometimes, these narrowed blood vessels can get blocked which can cut off the blood supply to the heart or brain leading to a heart attack or a stroke. By lowering your cholesterol levels, you can reduce your risk of having a heart attack a stroke or related health problems.

Your doctor may decide to increase your dose. This is so that you are taking the amount of Rosuvastatin that is right for you. If you started with a 5 mg dose, your doctor may decide to double the to 10 mg end then 10 mg, your doctor may decide to double this to 20 mg and then 40 mg if necessary. There will be a gap of four weeks between every dose adjustment. The maximum daily dose of Rosuvastatin Film-coated Tablets is 40 mg, It is only for patients with high cholesterol levels and a high risk of heart attacks or stroke, whose cholesterol levels are not lowered enough with 20 mg.

If you forget to take Rosuvastatin Film-coated Tablets
Do not worry, just take your next scheduled dose at the correct time. Do not take a double dose to make up for a forgotten dose.

If you stop taking Rosuvastatin Film-coated Tablets Talk to your doctor if you want to stop taking Rosuvastatin. Your cholesterol levels might increase again if you stop taking Rosuvastatin. If you have any further questions on the use of this medicine, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

4 Possible side effects

Like all medicines, this medicine can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them. It is important that you are aware of what these side effects may be. They are usually mild and disappear after a short time.

Stop taking Rosuvastatin and seek medical help immediately if you have any of the following allergic reactions:

difficulty in breathing, with or without swelling of the face, lips, tongue and/or throat swelling of the face, lips, tongue and/or throat swelling of the face, lips, tongue and/or throat, which may cause difficulty in swellowing
severe itching of the skin (with raised tumps).
